These emerging issues were identified:

- The quantity of content on the course was recognised as a strength in terms of breadth. However, the importance of the specification to be forward-thinking and future proofed were emphasised.
- The potential for an inquiry approach to the teaching and learning of economics was recognised. A desire for more information on the inquiry approach was highlighted.
- Regarding assessment, the importance of developing students' key skills was emphasised e.g. Logical and numerical reasoning skills. The necessity of moving away from learnt-off answers was emphasised.
- A draft specification should be available for consultation in early 2016.
