	approach to teaching Economics. Their approach is based on the Teaching for Understanding
	Framework. It is a student-centred approach that focuses on how students use and apply their
	knowledge. Some considerations that emerged from the session included:
	 The core concepts we wish to impart
	 Examine the course from a key skills perspective
	 The integration of micro- and macro-economic elements of the course
	 The importance of reflecting on learning

• Continuing importance of accommodating skills development and active teaching methodologies
